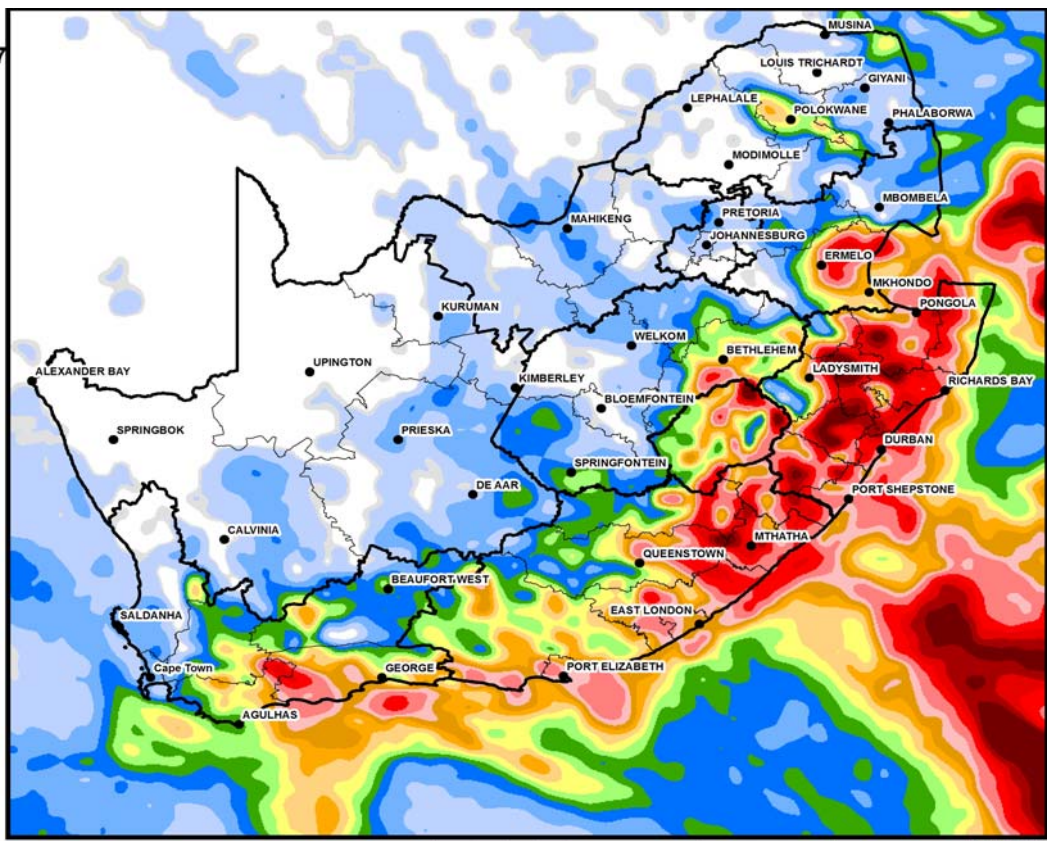
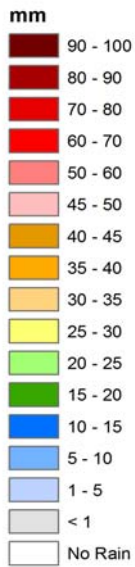

Rainfall: 14 to 20 November 2017

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Figure 1: Expected precipitation: 14 to 20 November 2017.

Good rainfall is expected for the southern and eastern regions of South Africa between 14 to 16 November 2017. The weekend will be clear over South Africa with no rain expected.

Snow is expected over the Eastern Cape and southern Drakensberg on 15 November, with expected snowfalls continuing on 16 November over the rest of the Drakensberg mountains, resulting in minimum and maximum temperatures dropping across the country from Thursday.

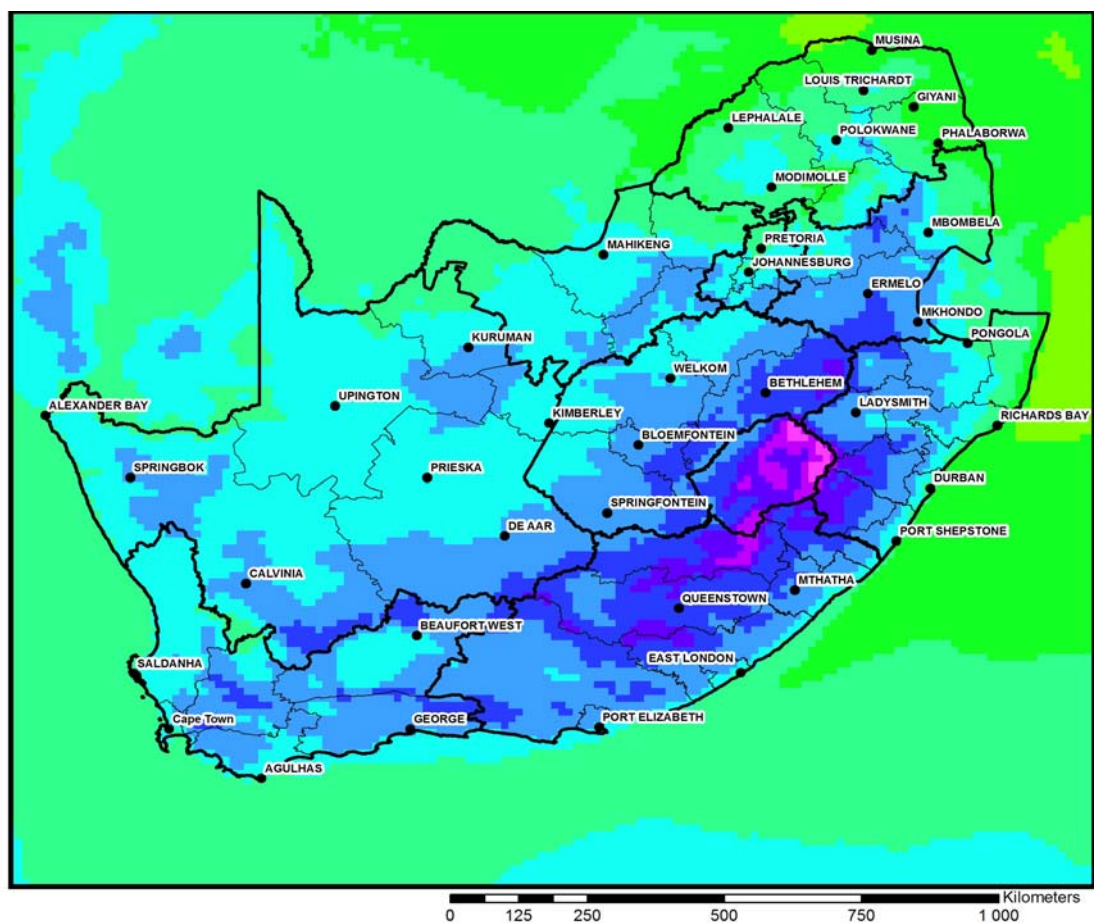


Figure 2: Average Minimum Temperatures, 14 to 20 November 2017.

The average minimum temperatures will be much lower this week due to the snow expected in the Eastern Cape and Drakensberg mountains on 15 and 16 November. Minimum temperatures will drop drastically from Thursday over the interior of the country. Minimum temperatures will increase slightly over the weekend.



Average Maximum Temperatures: 14 to 20 November 2017

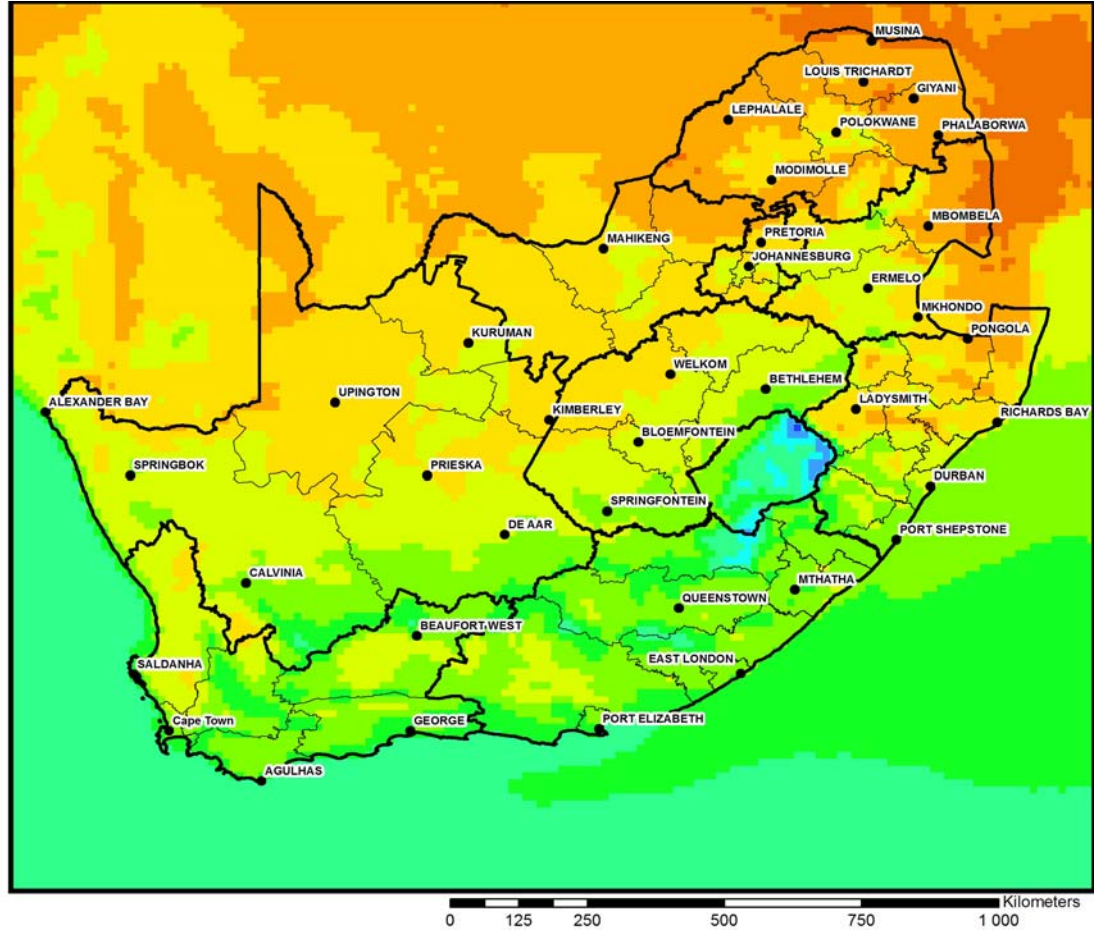
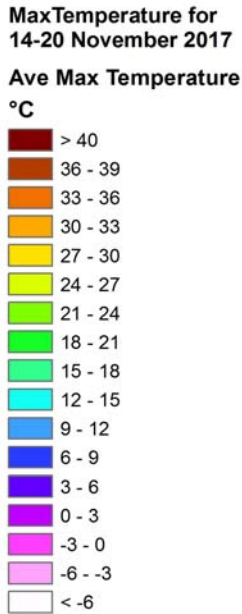


Figure 3: Average Maximum Temperatures, 14 to 20 November 2017

Although this week will start off with extremely warm conditions over the northern regions of the country, maximum temperatures will drop over much of South Africa due to snow over the Eastern Cape and Drakensberg mountains. Winter conditions are expected for Thursday and Friday, but the maximum temperatures will increase over the weekend with mild to warm temperatures expected over much of the northern regions.

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
